METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLANNING PROCESS

- What is it?
 - Process by which transportation decisions are made and projects are planned, selected, and prioritized for implementation within the region.



METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLANNING PROCESS

- Why is it important?
 - Decides how a large part of the federal transportation funding is spent Nationwide.
 - Helps the MPO to prioritize regional needs and determine the best and most economical solution.
 - Provides the framework for the future transportation system.

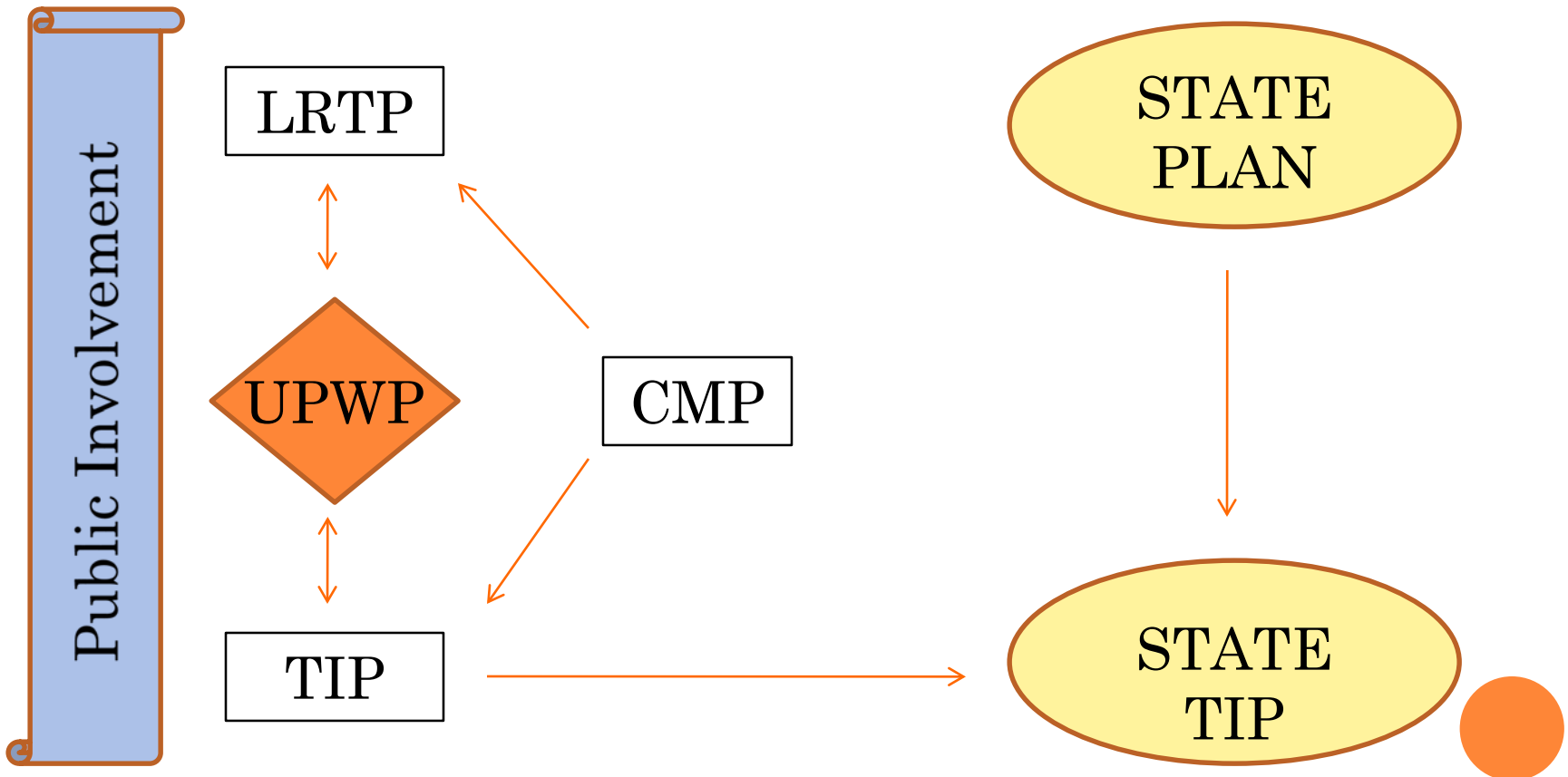
