AGENDA ITEM #1 – APPROVAL OF THE SEPTEMBER 24, 2013 BPCC MEETING MINUTES

MOTION BY MR. OVERMYER TO APPROVE THE AUGUST 27, 2013 BPCC MEETING MINUTES. SECONDED BY MR. ANDERSON. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

NEW BUSINESS

AGENDA ITEM #2 – APPROVAL OF THE 2012 CMR

Mr. Gogoi discussed the 2012 CMR. Last year MPO staff developed a preliminary version of the 2012 Congestion Monitoring Report which was presented at its September 25, 2012 meeting for review and comments. The document was complete except for a section on Congestion Management Performance Report which evaluated the condition of the Lee County transportation network and reported system trends. This section called *the State of the System (SOS)* Report was completed in August this year, and presented to all the committees and the MPO Board. The SOS Report was presented to the BPCC at its August 29, 2013 meeting. The section is now complete and was approved by the TMOC in October 2013.

MOTION BY MR. MOSER TO APPROVE THE 2012 CMR. SECONDED BY MR. OVERMYER. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

<u>AGENDA ITEM #3 – APPROVAL OF BIKE PED PROJECT PRIORITIZATION</u> CRITERIA

The MPO's consultants, Alta Planning & Design and Jacobs, presented a final draft of the project selection process for TAP and Multi-modal Enhancement funds including a modification of the existing steps involved in the selection process and an overhaul of the existing bicycle pedestrian prioritization criteria. One of the additional steps that was included in the project selection process is the screening of the candidate projects by a BPCC subcommittee before the pre-application phase. Discussion ensued on the criteria for the project screening process and also the scoring methodology on some of the matrices in the project prioritization criteria.

The consultants informed the committee that they would present performance measures and a shovel ready guide for local governments at the December meeting.

MOTION BY MR. GETCH TO APPROVE THE BIKE PED PROJECT PRIORITIZATION CRITERIA. SECONDED BY MR. OVERMYER. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

The committee also established a subcommittee to screen the projects including Andy Getch of LCDOT, Dan Moser of Injury Prevention Council, Avelino Cancel of the City of Fort Myers, Stephanie Smith of the City of Cape Coral, Jeff Davis of the City of Bonita Springs, Dawn Huff of the LC School District and Mark Tesoro of Lee Memorial. The committee directed staff to poll these members to schedule the subcommittee meeting.

AGENDA ITEM #4 - SRTS PROJECT SELECTION UPDATE

Ms. Huff reported that a SRTS subcommittee discussed candidate projects and selected five projects, three from unincorporated Lee County, one from the City of Fort Myers and one from the City of Cape Coral. She gave an overview on each of the projects.

<u>AGENDA ITEM #5 - DISCUSSION ON POTENTIAL REGIONAL PATHWAYS PROJECTS</u>

The committee discussed each of the candidate projects for regional enhancement funds and identified two projects from Lee County that would compete for District 1 TAP funds. These projects included paved shoulders on Old 41 from Bonita Beach Road to US 41 in Collier County and a PD&E Study for a pathway on Pine Island Road from Veterans Parkway to Stringfellow Road. The committee instructed staff to include these projects for the project screening process.

TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE BICYCLE PEDESTRIAN SAFETY ACTION PLAN

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Provide input and direction on items related to the

implementation of the Bicycle Pedestrian Safety Action

Plan.

There are several ongoing tasks related to the implementation of the Bicycle Pedestrian Safety Action Plan that staff is currently working on that we would like to get some input and direction on:

- Staff is currently reviewing the crash descriptions for the Bicycle and Pedestrian
 fatalities for the last year and half to see if there are patterns and trends that we
 can address as part of the implementation strategies. Attached is a breakdown
 of that data for 2012 and for 2013 through September. Staff is seeking input from
 the local agencies on what they may be doing locally related to this type of
 analysis.
- Staff is working with one of FDOT's engineering consultants on the first four intersections where road safety audits will be conducted. The first four are listed below and staff is seeking concurrence from the Committee:
 - US 41 and Six Mile Cypress Parkway;
 - SR 80 and Marsh Avenue:
 - SR 78 and Santa Barbara Boulevard:
 - Colonial Boulevard and Six Mile Cypress Parkway
- A meeting has been set up for December 10th with law enforcement agencies in Lee County to discuss what can be done to address bicycle and pedestrian safety issues. Staff is currently working on an agenda and is seeking input from the Committee.

The MPO Board will be taking action on the recommendations from the executive summary at its November 22nd meeting, and the MPO action will be reported by staff at the November 26th BPCC meeting.

PRESENTATION OF COLLIER MPO BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN SAFETY STUDY

RECOMMENDED ACTION: This is not an action. Collier MPO stuff will provide a

presentation on their bicycle and pedestrian safety

study.

The Collier MPO's Pathways Advisory Committee (PAC) works throughout the year to review pedestrian and bicycle projects. The PAC recommends projects in the spring each year to the MPO Board for future funding consideration. These projects benefit the bicyclists and pedestrians of Collier County.

The Collier MPO is in the process of developing a Bicycle/Pedestrian Safety Study. The purpose of this study is to develop a better understanding of the safety issues in Collier County for Bicyclists and Pedestrians. The safety study will assist the PAC in more effectively evaluating the safety benefit of each project that they prioritize and recommend.

Consultants are currently working with MPO staff and the PAC on the three components of this study:

- Analysis of Crash Data from Police Reports
- Collecting Data from a Survey to Capture Non-reported Crashes
- Development of Safety Criteria that may be used by the PAC to Evaluate Future Projects

Collier MPO staff will present an overview of the Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Study. This study is expected to conclude by the end of February 2014.

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
PRESENTATION ON THE UPDATED LEE COUNTY BICYCLE AND SIDEWALK FACILITY MAPS


RECOMMENDED ACTION: This is not an action. MPO staff will present the

updated bicycle and sidewalk facility maps which also

illustrate facilities that were completed after 2010.

MPO staff recently prepared facility maps that illustrate updated countywide bicycle and sidewalk facilities. These maps also illustrate facilities that were constructed after 2010 when the MPO completed its Countywide Bicycle Pedestrian Master Plan. Staff will provide a status of our review and the process for keeping the maps up to date. The Bike Facilities map is the first step in providing the next version (4th Edition) of the Bike Facilities Map of Lee County.





REPORT ON THE TAP AND MPO BOX FUNDED PROJECT SCREENING MEETING

RECOMMENDED ACTION: This is not an action. MPO staff will report on the

project screening process, the sub-committee meeting that was held and the list of bicycle and pedestrian projects that will go into the next stage of the selection

process.

The MPO added a project screening process as part of its project selection and prioritization process for TAP and MPO Multimodal 'Box' funds. On November 12th, a BPCC Subcommittee reviewed and screened the projects and discussed any potential issues. All the projects were cleared to move to the pre-application phase. The committee also concurred on a staff suggestion to add a sidewalk project on the west side of San Carlos Boulevard from Kelly Road north to Pine Manor Street to the list. The entire list of projects is **attached**. In addition, staff met with FDOT last week to discuss the project applications and their new timeline which is **attached**. Staff will provide an overview of that discussion at the meeting.

OVERVIEW OF THE RAIL FEASIBILITY STUDY RECOMMENDATIONS

DISCUSSION ITEM

Since September of last year, a consulting team headed by David Plummer and Associates has been working on the MPO Rail Feasibility Study of the CSX/Seminole Gulf Corridor. The Study has assessed the long term feasibility of implementing public multi-modal transportation options within the corridor through Lee and northern Collier County, while maintaining and possibly expanding freight service in the corridor. The multimodal options include running commuter rail transit, light rail transit, bus rapid transit and/or a multiuse path from the Charlotte County line through Lee County into northern Collier County.

As part of the scope, the consulting team also assessed existing and future freight issues, determined the preliminary value of the CSX/Seminole Gulf Lease and Leasehold, and looked into various options of preserving the corridor including purchasing rail interests (buying the underlying right of way and/or the SGL lease), negotiating new and/or existing agreements, and adopting supportive comprehensive plan and other preservation policies by local governments and MPOs along the rail corridor.

The study is now complete and the technical reports that were done as part of this project are available on our website www.leempo.com. The MPO staff will give an overview on the study recommendations and will report on the discussion and actions taken at the MPO Board meeting.
