#### CALL TO ORDER

Ms. Linda Carter called the meeting to order at 10:00 am.

#### AGENDA ITEM #1 – APPROVAL OF THE JANUARY 28, 2015 BPCC MEETING MINUTES

#### MOTION BY MS.CARTER TO APPROVE THE JANUARY 28, 2015 BPCC MEETING MINUTES. SECONDED BY MR. SHUTE. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### AGENDA ITEM #2- ELECTION OF NEW OFFICERS

Mr. Gogoi stated that under existing bylaws an officer cannot serve consecutive terms in the same office, and that it is the practice of this committee to elect the current Vice Chair as the new Chair. The current Vice Chair Ms. Linda Carter expressed her willingness to

serve as the new Chair. Mr. Moser had earlier informed staff over electronic mail that he would be interested in the post of Vice Chair.

#### MOTION BY MR. JANSEN TO NOMINATE MS.CARTER AS THE CHAIR. SECONDED BY MR. GETCH. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

MOTION BY MR. CHUPACK TO NOMINATE MR. DAN MOSER AS THE VICE CHAIR. SECONDED BY MR. CANCEL. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

#### AGENDA ITEM #4 – OVERVIEW ON THE STATUS OF THE LEE MPO BICYCLE PEDESTRIAN SAFETY ACTION PLAN RECOMMENDATIONS

Mr. Scott Staff provided a power point presentation on the status of the recommendations from the Lee MPO Bicycle Pedestrian Master Plan. The Master Plan will be updated as part of the development of the 2040 Long Range Plan. All comments that have been received at the various MPO advisory committee meetings will be incorporated in the final report which will be presented at a future BPCC meeting.

#### AGENDA ITEM #5 – DISCUSSION ON CHANGES TO MAPS FROM THE OGT GREENWAYS AND TRAIL SYSTEM PLAN

Mr. Gogoi explained that due to the recent developments in trail funding in Florida, and the possibility of more funding opportunities, MPO staff is proposing changes to the Lee portion of the Land Trails Opportunities Map and the Priority Trails Map to maximize their opportunities of tapping into these funds. An overview of the proposed changes in both maps were provided. Some connectors were proposed to be removed as it was no longer feasible to build them on lands given ownership hurdles and policies. The changes would be brought back again at a later time to the BPCC along with the changes to the Southwest Coast Connector that may be proposed by a working group comprised of BPCC and PAC members.

#### AGENDA ITEM #6 – REPORT ON BIKE PED PRE-APPLICATIONS

Mr. Gogoi reported the results of the TA/Box Fund Project Proposal Screening Subcommittee Meeting that was held on December 5, 2014. Pre-applications for construction feasibility were developed and submitted to FDOT for all the projects reviewed at that meeting except the bike lanes on McGregor. Mr. Getch informed the committee that the County would like to submit a pre-application for new sidewalks at the Harnes Marsh Elementary School. The project was unintentionally left out from the screening process, and that the project was actually identified as a candidate project at a meeting held after the November Technical Advisory Committee meeting to discuss projects benefitting schools. The BPCC concurred that the County could submit a preapplication for this project. A table of unfunded project priorities from the year before was also presented, and staff informed the committee that pre-applications were also being submitted for these projects.

#### OLD BUSINESS

#### AGENDA ITEM #6 – STAFF UPDATE ON ONGOING PROJECTS

Mr. Gogoi reported that there was funding shortfall for the SR 80 Shared Use Path from Shoreland to Buckingham, and the Leland Heights Boulevard Sidewalk project from Homestead to Richmond, with both projects scheduled for construction in FY 2016. One way to address the shortfall would be to make up for the difference in one project from the other, and deferring the construction of the other project to FY 2018. Mr. Jansen questioned whether the DDR funds committed for the SR 80 project could be used on the Leland Heights Boulevard project if that project were to be build first. There was a consensus of using funds from SR 80 to complete the Leland Heights Boulevard project in its entirety, while staging the construction of the SR 80 project with priority being given to the segment with the highest pedestrian demand. There was also a discussion on the JYLP extension being a Feasibility or a PD&E project.

#### OTHER BUSINESS

## AGENDA ITEM #7 – PUBLIC AND MEMBER COMMENTS ON ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA

Lt. Bueno announced that FHP and LCSO would be conducting a multimodal detail on SR 82 on February 17<sup>th</sup>. The exercise was being conducted to raise awareness for bicyclists, pedestrians and motor vehicle drivers and will be targeting high profile crash locations on that corridor.

Ms. Letourneau asked that an emergency meeting of the BPCC should be held this year if necessary to review and discuss projects proposed in FDOT's New Draft Tentative Work Program for FY 2016 through FY 2021. She also informed the committee that interviews with LAB representative Steve Clark on his assessments of bike infrastructure in Lee County were posted in BikeWalkLee web site.

#### AGENDA ITEM #8 – LOCAL GOVERNMENT REPORTS

Ms. Hagen stated that 30% design plans have been completed for the Old 41 improvements in downtown Bonita Springs, and that a public workshop was being held on January 28<sup>th</sup> from 4 pm to 7 pm to take public input on these plans. The project limits were from Rosemary to Bonita Beach Boulevard.

Mr. Cancel announced that there will be a League of American Bicyclists Ride on February 4<sup>th</sup> that will assess and pinpoint potential improvements to the City of Fort Myers bicycle infrastructure.

Ms. Kirkland reported the results of a similar ride in the City of Sanibel on January 12<sup>th</sup>.

Mr. Gasperini reported on the Cape bicycle infrastructure assessment by Steve Clark of LAB while Mr. Chupack announced a 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Bike Safety Rodeo at Cape's Christa McAuliffe and Oasis Elementary Schools on February 7<sup>th</sup>.

Mr. Jansen commented that the FDOT final design plans on the safety project at the intersection of MLK and SR 82 missed the target. The ramps were not right, pedestrian push button signals were in the wrong place, and sidewalks were missing on one corner. FDOT had not asked for county input during the development of these plans.

Ms. Huff and Ms. Yanes of the Lee County School District reiterated the role of the District in providing bike ped safety education. They have partnered with All Schools Hospital of Tampa in providing safety classes in elementary and middle schools.

#### AGENDA ITEM #9 – LEETRAN REPORT

Ms. Bielawska reported that LeeTran has moved to its new facility on Evans and is operating from there.

#### AGENDA ITEM #10 – FDOT REPORT

Mr. Harris announced that FDOT will be hosting a series of regional workshops on the Florida Transportation Plan.

#### AGENDA ITEM #12 – ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mr. Gogoi announced that the SW Coast Connector Working Group will be meeting on January 30<sup>th</sup> from 10 am to 12 noon at Estero Community Park and Recreation Center, Estero.

#### REPORT ON THE SUBMITTAL OF PRELIMINARY BIKE PED PRIORITIES FOR MPO MULTIMODAL ENHANCEMENT BOX AND TA FUNDS

**RECOMMENDED ACTIONS:** 

This is not an action item. Staff will report on the preliminary bicycle pedestrian priorities for the Lee MPO Multi-modal Enhancement Box Funds and the Lee MPO TA funds that were submitted to FDOT on March 13<sup>th</sup>.

The Lee MPO will be submitting transportation project priorities to FDOT in June this year for consideration of state and federal funds during the development of the state's new Work Program for FY 2017 through FY 2021. However, FDOT has asked the MPO's also to provide preliminary priorities for the various funding categories by March 13<sup>th</sup>.

One of these funding categories is the Multi-modal Enhancement Box funds which are funds set aside from the Lee MPO's allocation of TMA funds (federal funds allocated to MPOs with an urbanized area population over 200,000). These funds are used by the MPO to implement bicycle/pedestrian, transit and congestion management projects.

The other funding category of interest to the BPCC is the Lee MPO Transportation Alternative (TA) funds.

In keeping with the FDOT schedule requirements, staff compiled and transmitted to FDOT the two (2) attached lists of preliminary bike ped priorities for both categories of funding using scores from the project screening process conducted in December 2014 for all new projects and November 2013 for all unfunded projects from the previous year. A detailed and intensive analysis of the candidate projects will be conducted using the MPO's comprehensive evaluation criteria and presented to the BPCC for review and approval in June. The final priority order will likely change for both lists, when these projects have gone through the project reviews and the final scoring criteria is applied to the projects that move forward this year.

This is not an action item. Law enforcement agencies in Lee County will provide an update on their bicycle pedestrian education and enforcement programs.






#### **RECOMMENDED ACTION:**






