Agenda Item #3 - Public Comments on Items on the Agenda

There were no public comments on items on the agenda.

Agenda Item #4 - *Approval of June 27, 2023 Meeting Minutes

Ms. Teresa Lewis made the motion to approve the June 27, 2023 Meeting Minutes. Ms. Syndi Bultman seconded the motion. There were no objections, and the motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item #5 - *Approval of the SS4A Funded Safety Action Plan Scope

M. Don Scott presented this agenda item for the approval of the SS4A Funded Safety Action Scope that was included in the agenda packet, [posted to the MPO website](#), and reviewed at the meeting.

Ms. Teresa Lewis made the motion to approve the SS4A Funded Safety Action Plan Scope. Ms. Jennifer Hagen seconded the motion. There were no objections, and the motion passed.

Agenda Item #6 - *Approval of the SUN Trail Priorities

Mr. Ron Gogoi presented this agenda item for the approval of the SUN Trail Priorities that were included in the agenda packet and [posted to the MPO website](#). He provided a Power Point presentation that can be viewed at the following link: [SUN Trail Priorities](#)

Ms. Tanya Merkle reported that FDOT is soliciting for SUN Trail proposals that will be considered for funding during the development of the FY 2026 - FY 2030 Work Program. Mr. Gogoi explained the connection between the solicitation notice and the MPO's proposed list of priorities. He provided a summary of the projects and mentioned that the projects were vetted by the committee at earlier meetings.

Mr. David Wagley made the motion to approve the SUN Trail Priorities. Ms. Jennifer Hagen seconded the motion. There were no objections, and the motion passed.

Under discussions, Mr. Gogoi presented a table of unfunded priorities from last year and he mentioned that those projects may be considered for funding during the ongoing development of the FY 2025 – FY 2029 Draft Tentative Work Program. FDOT is expected to release the new Work Program by the middle of October.

Agenda Item #7 - Discussion on the FDOT Proposed Collier to Polk SUN Trail Alignment

Mr. Scott presented this agenda item. He provided the background and the context of the Collier to Polk Regional Trail while explaining the OGT Statewide Priority Land Trail Corridors and the Statewide Opportunity Land Trail Corridors Maps. These three exhibits were included in the agenda packet and [posted in the MPO website](#).

Mr. Gogoi explained the difference in funding available for the two top ranked regional priority corridors as compared to the rest of the priority corridors, and the possible impact of this proposed regional trail on funding of the Gulf Coast Trail. Agenda Item #8 - Presentation on the Caloosahatchee Bridge Pedestrian Facility

Mr. Joe Lauk, FDOT's consultant for this project, presented the Caloosahatchee Bridge Pedestrian Facility. He explained the bridge cross section and structure mentioning that the expansion gap in the middle will no longer be there after construction with the bridge decks essentially tied together. He also reported on the construction schedule and discussed the MOT practices and the detour to be followed using the Edison Bridge while the construction is under way. Agenda Item #10 - Discussion of Proposed Amendment to the BPCC Bylaws

Chair Burden mentioned that Agenda Item #11 was taken out of order causing this item to be skipped over. Mr. Gogoi asked if any of the committee members had reviewed the updated bylaws document that was attached to the agenda packet and [posted to the MPO website](#). Mr. David Wagley asked about the red and blue notations in the document. Mr. Gogoi quickly summarized the main changes and suggested deferring the item to a future meeting. He asked those with comments to call him or send him their comments. Mr. Gogoi reminded the committee members that the October 24th BPCC meeting will be a joint meeting with Collier MPO's Bike Ped Advisory Committee (BPAC). He suggested that the BPCC could meet immediately before or immediately after the joint meeting on October 24th to discuss the bylaws and then bring them back for a vote at the November meeting. He also provided a list of items that the Collier MPO BPAC suggested for the joint meeting agenda including a US BR 15 status update, Bonita Estero Rail Trail update and litter/debris removal, Moving Florida Forward projects, law enforcement updates, micromobility ordinance update, and distracted driving campaign. Mr. Gogoi asked if the Lee County MPO BPCC members had any ideas for items. The BPCC members suggested local micromobility ordinance efforts, and fatality/serious injury updates for both counties. The committee discussed the possible November 28 BPCC meeting conflict with the Thanksgiving holiday, but all members present agreed to hold the November 28 meeting. Chair Burden suggested discussing the bylaws in October and voting in November. Mr. Gogoi said the joint meeting could start at 9:30 a.m. for the Lee County BPCC members to discuss the bylaws changes. Those present agreed.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Agenda Item #3 - Election of a Chairperson

Ms. Huff made the motion to elect Collier MPO's BPAC Chair Anthony Matonti to chair the workshop. Mr. Stryker seconded the motion. There were no objections, and the motion passed.

Agenda Item #4 - Public Comments on Items on the Agenda

Agenda Item #5 - Approval of Agenda

Ms. Bultman made the motion to approve the agenda. Mr. Dondanville seconded the motion. There were no objections, and the motion passed.

Agenda Item #6 - Florida Department of Transportation

Ms. Merkle announced that SUN Trail applications are open until December 20, 2023.

Agenda Item #7 - Reports and Presentations

A. Status on Collier to Polk Regional Trail

Mr. Kingston provided an overview of this agenda item by noting that FDOT proposed the addition of the Collier to Polk Regional Trail to the SUN Trail Network to upgrade existing Opportunity Trail Corridors to Priority Trail Corridors within Collier MPO, Polk, and Heartland Regional TPOs. The shared-use pathway projects proposed within the two alignments would become eligible to apply for SUN Trail funding if the Florida Greenways and Trails Council approves the addition to the SUN Trail network map.

A group discussion followed regarding improvements and maintenance of the trail.

B. Status on Marco Island Loop

Mr. Kingston provided a status update for the Marco Island Loop project, explaining that the Collier MPO Board approved a resolution on September 8, 2023, accepting FDOT's final report on the Marco Island Loop Trail Feasibility Study and Conceptual Design and directing staff to take the necessary steps to request SUN Trail funding for a Project Development and Environment Study. C. Status on Projects along the SR 82/SR 29 Corridor

Mr. Gogoi, Mr. Kingston, and Mr. Marquardt provided a Power Point presentation on projects along the SR 82 and SR 29 Corridors, and the proposed Alico Road Extension that intersects SR 82. All 5 projects can be viewed at the following link: [SR 82/SR 29 Updates](#)

Group discussions regarding this presentation included speed limits on different segments of the proposed projects, and the possibilities for more shared-use paths.

D. Status on US Bike Route 15 expansion with proposed networks in Lee and Collier Counties

E. Discussion on Traffic Crashes, Traffic Enforcement, and Micromobility Regulations

Mr. Kingston explained that it is a three-part item, including how Micromobility Regulations are playing out in jurisdictions in Lee and Collier County, traffic enforcement as it applies to each county, and traffic crash data for both counties.

Mr. Gogoi provided an overview of Micromobility Regulations in Lee County, and the similarities and dissimilarities of Micromobility ordinances adopted by these jurisdictions. His presentation can be viewed at the following link: [Micromobility Regulations](#)

Sgt. Horowitz with Collier County Sheriffs Office spoke about how traffic enforcement statutes need to be updated to keep up with transportation technology and that the sheriff's office does its best to educate the community about pedestrian and bicyclist safety. A group discussion followed regarding more ways to implement safety measures for pedestrians and bicyclists in Lee and Collier counties. Mr. Burden and Ms. Bultman provided the Lee County perspective.

Mr. Kemmish explained the methodology to capture traffic crash data in Florida and stated that the 60-day hold on reports as per Florida Statutes were skewing the 2023 fatality and serious injury numbers. Mr. Kingston presented crash data for Collier County while Mr. Gogoi focused only on one slide (due to lack of time) that compared Daily Average Vehicle Miles Travelled (VMT) for the two counties. He stated that the escalating VMT in Lee County was the reason why there were more crashes in Lee County. APPROVAL OF AMENDMENT TO THE BPCC BYLAWS

ACTION ITEM: Review the additional changes to the bylaws shown below and amend the BPCC Bylaws.

The proposed amendments include changing the term limits of officers to be in line with the bylaws of the other MPO advisory committees. This means officers can be re-elected after the expiration of their one year terms and can serve consecutive terms. Amendments also include deleting the Lee County Community Traffic Safety Team from the voting membership and reinstating the Lee County Department of Transportation to the voting membership. Amendments also include cleaning up the language in the Responsibilities Section of the Bylaws by deleting responsibilities that do not serve a purpose or may be outside the purview of this committee.

The proposed amendments were discussed at length at the October 24th BPCC meeting. Subsequently, staff made the following additional changes under *Section 4C. Membership*:

- C. *Each voting agency member shall appoint a staff person and an alternate to represent it on the committee. A voting agency member which includes one of the six municipalities may choose to appoint, at its discretion, a non-staff person from the general public as its representative due to staff availability constraints. However, in such cases, the appointee must reside within the municipal city limits of that member agency and must be a year round resident. An alternate, if one is appointed from the general public, however, can serve in the committee even if they are not year round residents but must live within the municipal limits of the member agency at least 6 months of the year.*

Attachment A includes a clean version of the amended bylaws while **Attachment B** includes a version with comments. The committee will be asked to approve the proposed amendments at its November 28th meeting. **The amendments once approved by the BPCC will become effective only after they are ratified by the MPO Board at its January 19, 2024 meeting.**

BYLAWS

of the Lee County Metropolitan Planning Organization

BICYCLE PEDESTRIAN COORDINATING COMMITTEE

Section 1. **NAME**

The name of this committee shall be the Bicycle Pedestrian Coordinating Committee (BPCC).

Section 2. **RESPONSIBILITIES**

It shall be the responsibility of this committee to:

- A. Coordinate the bicycle/pedestrian planning and programming activities of all agencies participating in the Lee County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO);
- B. Participate in discussions and provide guidance to staff as needed when a local government or a 501 (C) (3) non-profit seek financial or staff assistance in mapping, safety education outreach, local govt. plan updates, implementing facility improvements, etc., related to vulnerable road users;
- C. Recommend bicycle and pedestrian project priorities for federal and state funds including but not limited to Transportation Alternative, Multimodal Transportation Enhancement Box, SUN Trail Program, Safe Route to School Program, and Carbon Reduction Program funds;
- D. Guide staff in the implementation of the Lee County Bicycle Pedestrian Master Plan and Plan Updates. Also participate and provide input during the comprehensive updates and amendments of the MPO Long Range Transportation Plan;
- E. Support and encourage sustainability initiatives in Lee County, and participate in discussions on emerging technology (Micromobility, Autonomous, Connected, Electric and Shared Vehicles (ACES), On Demand Delivery Services, Artificial Intelligence, etc.) that may impact pedestrians and bicyclists;
- F. Provide input during FDOT presentations on Project Development and Environment (PD&E) studies and design plans to ensure that adequate provisions for cyclists and pedestrians are included in the planning and designs of new and reconstructed highways, and that they are consistent with the MPO's Countywide Bicycle Pedestrian Master Plan and the MPO Long Range Transportation Plan
- G. Capitalize on opportunities for developer implementation of bicycle pedestrian improvements;
- H. Capitalize on opportunities for Public Private Partnerships to implement bicycle pedestrian improvements;
- I. Partner with community groups to host public events to educate the community about the Bicycle Pedestrian Master Plan and seek their involvement and support in implementing the bike/ped improvements identified in the Plan;
- J. Guide staff in the implementation of Demonstration and Special Projects, or Spot Improvements that may be identified in the Master Plan;
- K. Capitalize on opportunities to expand and maintain textual and visual consistency of bicycle and pedestrian wayfinding signage within the county. Also, coordinate among agency members in the committee and offer input in the design and installation of uniform signage or sponsorship displays on trails that are part of the SUN Trail Network;
- L. Participate in the development of a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan for Lee County and participate in periodic updates of the Plan thereafter;
- M. Participate in FDEP updates of the Florida Greenways and Trails Master Plan, and in any trail alignment updates to the Lee County portion of the SUN Trail Network. Periodically update the Bike Facilities Map of Lee County, and develop, update, and maintain interactive bicycle and pedestrian maps and/or map apps as needed.

Section 3. **RELATIONSHIP TO THE TMOC AND OTHER AGENCIES**

- A. Proposals affecting motorized traffic operations shall be coordinated with the Lee County MPO's Traffic Management Operations Committee (TMOC) by participation of a BPCC member on the (TMOC). This member shall be appointed by the committee at a regular BPCC meeting.
- B. The committee should work directly with local and state government agencies, and other governmental and non-governmental institutions as necessary to coordinate their bicycle and pedestrian planning and programming activities.

Section 4. **MEMBERSHIP**

- A. **VOTING MEMBER:** The voting membership of this committee shall consist of four (4) At Large Citizens, and representatives from each of the following agencies:
 - ❖ City of Bonita Springs
 - ❖ City of Cape Coral
 - ❖ City of Fort Myers
 - ❖ Town of Fort Myers Beach
 - ❖ City of Sanibel

 - ❖ Village of Estero
 - ❖ Lee County Department of Community Development
 - ❖ Lee County Department of Transportation
 - ❖ MPO Citizen Advisory Committee
 - ❖ LeeTran
 - ❖ School District of Lee County
 - ❖ Lee County Injury Prevention Coalition
 - ❖ Lee County Parks & Recreation
 - ❖ Lee County Visitor and Convention Bureau
 - ❖ Lee Memorial Health System
 - ❖ Lee County Port Authority
- B. **NON-VOTING ADVISORY MEMBER:** This committee shall include non-voting members from law enforcement agencies in Lee County.
- C. Each voting agency member shall appoint a staff person and an alternate to represent it on the committee. A voting agency member which includes one of the six municipalities may choose to appoint, at its discretion, a non-staff person from the general public as its representative due to staff availability constraints. However, in such cases, the appointee must reside within the municipal city limits of that member agency and must be a year round resident. An alternate, if one is appointed from the general public, however, can serve in the committee even if they are not year round residents but must live within the municipal limits of the member agency at least 6 months of the year.
- D. In the case of At Large Citizen Members, appointments shall be made by the MPO Policy Board. All such appointments are subject to ratification by a majority of members of the MPO at a regular MPO meeting at which a quorum is present.
- E. The At Large Citizen Members of the BPCC shall be citizens and year-round residents of the Metropolitan Planning Organization's transportation study area. Members or their immediate family members (spouse, child, parent, or sibling) shall not be declared candidates or elected officials of the Lee County Commission, municipalities in Lee County or Lee County Constitutional Officers. The At Large members shall not be employees of any of the local governments represented on the MPO or of the state or federal departments of transportation. Should the status of any of these BPCC members change in such a way as to disqualify him from membership under the terms of this paragraph, his/her membership shall automatically terminate. Those who thus become ineligible for BPCC membership shall provide written notice to the MPO staff and the BPCC Chairman. These requirements will also apply to non-staff members from the general public appointed by a municipality.

- F. At Large Members shall be granted an excused absence if they contact MPO staff prior to the meeting via email or by phone with a follow up email as to why they were unable to attend the meeting. Excused absences are counted as a regular absence. However, MPO staff will keep a record of excused and unexcused absences and present this record to the MPO Board if the member is in violation of the participation requirements. Should any member be absent from three (3) consecutive regular BPCC meetings, or from four (4) out of six (6) consecutive regular BPCC meetings within a twelve (12) month period, staff recommendation will be made to the MPO Board to remove this member for lack of participation, regardless of if the absence was excused or unexcused. This requirement will also apply to non-staff members from the general public appointed by a municipality, however, MPO staff recommendation for removal of the member will be made to the Town, Village, or City Council of that municipality through its Office of the Clerk.
- G. Should a temporary circumstance prevent an At Large Member from participation, a leave of absence may be granted by the BPCC for a period of no more than three (3) months. The member should submit the request to MPO Staff in writing and address it to the BPCC Chair. This requirement will also apply to non-staff members from the general public appointed by a municipality.
- H. All At Large Members will be required to complete the BPCC Application in Appendix C before they are appointed by the MPO Policy Board to ensure that they meet all the requirements. This will also apply to non-staff members from the general public appointed by a municipality.
- I. Agency appointees shall try to attend the meetings regularly. If they are unable to attend these meetings on a regular basis they should inform MPO staff, and have another staff person appointed immediately by the Department Head or the Appropriate Official. This does not apply to non-staff members from the general public appointed by a municipality.

Section 5. **OFFICERS**

- A. The officers of this committee shall consist of a Chair and a Vice Chair, both of whom shall be regular (*i.e.* not alternate) voting members of the committee.
- B. An election for both officers shall be held at the first regularly scheduled meeting of each calendar year.
- C. Each Officer so elected shall serve for one (1) year or until he or she is re-elected, or a successor is elected.
- D. The Chair shall preside at meetings of the committee and shall be responsible for the conduct of the meetings. The Chair shall be authorized to speak for and to sign correspondence and documents on behalf of the committee. The Chair shall appoint subcommittees and members to chair them and appoint members to represent the committee on joint task forces or other committees. The Chair shall consult with the MPO staff agency on the scheduling of meetings and their agendas.
- E. The Vice Chair shall, during the absence of the Chair or his inability to serve, have and exercise all of the duties and powers of the Chair. The Vice Chair shall also perform such other duties as may be assigned him by the Chair.
- F. In the absence of both the Chair and the Vice Chair from a meeting, a temporary Chair shall be elected.

Section 6. **MEETINGS**

- A. Meetings shall be held monthly at 10 a.m. on the Tuesday the week before the Technical Advisory Committee meeting, or as deemed necessary by the Chair and MPO staff.
- B. The members shall be sent agendas, and whenever possible, minutes of the previous meeting, no less than eight days before the date of each meeting. Agendas shall be sent to members either by regular mail or e-mail. Meetings may be cancelled, rescheduled, or relocated at the discretion of the Chair or MPO staff. However, on such occasions an eight (8) day advance notice shall be given to members by email. Members shall inform MPO staff at least twenty-four hours before the meeting whether they will attend.
- D. A quorum shall consist of 6 primary members, or their alternates.
- E. A joint meeting between the BPCC and the Collier MPO Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee, and a joint meeting between the BPCC and the Charlotte County-Punta Gorda MPO Bicycle Pedestrian Advisory Committee shall be held respectively as needed for the purpose of regional coordination. Quorum requirements for the BPCC in such meetings shall be 6 members.
- H. When a BPCC member abstains from a vote due to a conflict they must complete Form 8B which is included in Appendix B. BPCC member's conflicts of interest and compliance issues are guided by Section 112.3143 of the Florida Statutes.
- I. Meetings will be open to the public.

Section 7. **SUBCOMMITTEES**

Subcommittees may be appointed by the Chair to address specific projects or issues.

Section 8. **PUBLIC COMMENT PROCEDURE FOR MEETINGS AND WORKSHOPS**

- A. Each BPCC agenda will provide for public comment period for items on the agenda and items not on the agenda.
- B. Public comments will be limited to three minutes per speaker, The three minute limit may be modified by the Chair through an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the voting members present or their alternates.

Section 9. **AMENDMENTS**

- A. These Bylaws may be amended at any meeting by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the voting members present or their alternates, provided a copy of the proposed amendment(s) shall have been mailed or e-mailed to each member at least four calendar days before the meeting.
- B. Amendments shall be effective upon ratification by the MPO Policy Board.

BICYCLE PEDESTRIAN COORDINATING COMMITTEE

Section 1. NAME

The name of this committee shall be the Bicycle Pedestrian Coordinating Committee (BPCC).

Section 2. RESPONSIBILITIES

It shall be the responsibility of this committee to:

- E. ~~Continue to support~~Support and encourage sustainability initiatives in Lee County, and participate in discussions on emerging technology (Micromobility, Autonomous, Connected, Electric and Shared Vehicles (ACES), On Demand Delivery Services, Artificial Intelligence, etc.) that may impact pedestrians and bicyclists;
- F. ~~Review state~~Provide input during FDOT presentations on Project Development and Environment (PD&E) studies and design plans to ensure that adequate provisions for cyclists and pedestrians are included in the planning and designs of new and reconstructed highways, and that they are consistent with the MPO's Countywide Bicycle Pedestrian Master Plan and the MPO Long Range Transportation Plan, ~~or any specific committee recommendations that may have come out of any MPO meeting;~~
- G. Capitalize on opportunities for developer implementation of bicycle pedestrian improvements;
- H. Capitalize on opportunities for Public Private Partnerships to implement bicycle pedestrian improvements;
- I. Partner with community groups to host public events to educate the community about the Bicycle Pedestrian Master Plan and seek their involvement and support in implementing the bike/ped improvements identified in the Plan;
- J. ~~Review and assess Demonstration and Special Projects, and Spot improvements identified in the Master Plan and develop strategies for addressing these needs;~~Guide staff in the implementation of Demonstration and Special Projects, or Spot Improvements that may be identified in the Master Plan;
- K. ~~Review and assess bicycle and pedestrian signage countywide for consistency and, and identify opportunities for providing signage and way finding;~~Capitalize on opportunities to expand and maintain textual and visual consistency of bicycle and pedestrian wayfinding signage within the county. Also, coordinate among agency members in the committee and offer input in the design and installation of uniform signage or sponsorship displays on trails that are part of the SUN Trail Network;
- L. ~~Oversee the implementation of the MPO Bike Ped Safety Action Plan and update it as needed;~~Participate in the development of a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan for Lee County and participate in periodic updates of the Plan thereafter;

- M. Participate in FDEP updates of the Florida Greenways and Trails Master Plan, and in any trail alignment updates to the Lee County portion of the SUN Trail Network. Periodically update the Bike Facilities Map of Lee County, and develop, update, and maintain interactive bicycle and pedestrian maps and/or map apps as needed.

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Section 3. **RELATIONSHIP TO THE TMOC AND OTHER AGENCIES**

- A. Proposals affecting motorized traffic operations shall be coordinated with the Lee County MPO's Traffic Management Operations Committee (TMOC) by participation of a BPCC member on the (TMOC). This member shall be appointed by the committee at a regular BPCC meeting.
- B. The committee should work directly with local and state government agencies, and other governmental and non-governmental institutions as necessary to coordinate their bicycle and pedestrian planning and programming activities.

Section 4. **MEMBERSHIP**

- B. NON-VOTING ADVISORY MEMBER: This committee shall include non-voting members from law enforcement agencies in Lee County.
- C. Each voting agency member shall appoint a staff person and an alternate to represent it on the committee. A voting agency member which includes one of the six municipalities may choose to appoint, at its discretion, a non-staff person from the general public as its representative due to staff availability constraints. However, in such cases, the appointee must reside within the municipal city limits of that member agency and must be a year round resident. An alternate, if one is appointed from the general public, however, can serve in the committee even if they are not year round residents but must live within the municipal limits of the member agency at least 6 months of the year.
- D. In the case of At Large Citizen Members, appointments shall be made by the MPO Policy Board. All such appointments are subject to ratification by a majority of members of the MPO at a regular MPO meeting at which a quorum is present.
