

Don,

This afternoon I downloaded the Full Packet for Wednesday's meeting. I must say that I was shocked to see the addition of 2 pages (pages 29 and 30) in the presentation pertaining to how one public golf course in Washington State "secured" a Rail Trail that goes through their course. I do not recall ever seeing these pages in earlier copies of the MPO feasibility study nor do I believe that anyone from The Vines was ever made aware of this inadequate "solution".

Frankly I can not imagine where this came from and who could begin to think that this represents an apple to apples comparison to our situation. The Mount SI Golf Course is a public course with no homes on it. The Vines is a private course and club with approximately 435 private homes. The Mount SI Golf Course does not have a road that traverses the Rail Trail. The Vines has Vintage Trace, which is the sole access point for more than half of the residences in our community. And that is only the beginning of the differences between the two examples.....

A linear park has absolutely no place in our gated community. Please include this email comment in your information package to the members of the Executive Committee of the MPO for this week's meeting.

In reviewing the latest information for your meeting later this week, it appears that your planner has now added what is described as Snoqualmie gates for the golf cart crossings at the Vines in Estero. Now, after totally omitting the Vines and Estero Country Club from the planning map, they are making a futile effort to convince the MPO that a public golf course in the State of Washington has a relation to having a bike path running through a secure, gated golf course community in Lee County, Florida.

Those new gates and fencing only highlight further the inappropriateness of having a bike path come through the middle of this golf course. Not only would these gates as depicted create havoc in the use of the golf course, but whenever they open up the gates it would allow migration of bikers and walkers into our otherwise secure, guarded community.

Again, I stress that we asked Ned Baier if there was another gated golf course community in the USA that has a bike path bisecting it. While he promised they were researching it, the only one he has found to date is this public course in Snoqualmie Washington which has no houses along the course or the path. Still, Volker has presented not one gated golf course community with such a path and certainly not one path through a gated golf course community in the State of Florida.

Separate and apart from the negative impacts upon the Vines and Estero Country Club, the report as presented totally ignores the intrusions in the backyards of the adjacent San Carlos Park neighborhood and the otherwise isolated community at Granada Lakes near Alico Blvd. The bike path as proposed would run right through the backyards of private homeowners in San Carlos Park and would destroy the views and privacy of the homes in Granada Lakes while also allowing invasion of their clubhouse and bathroom facilities. Dear Mr. Scott:

We are residents of The Vines at Estero Country Club. We are advised your office is responsible for research, planning and execution of the proposed project to convert the Seminole Rail Trail into a bike/walking trail, running from North Naples through Bonita Springs, Estero and San Carlos Park to the Alico Rail Trail.

We have attended several public hearings on the Rails to Trails project, held in Estero and Bonita Springs. We have heard the glowing testimonials from those in favor of the project, but no one – planner, biker or politician – has focused much on our many, significant comments, questions and concerns about how the project will negatively affect the security, safety, home values and lifestyle of Vines residents. Instead, we are told the plan is still in its infancy and the current focus is on finding sufficient funding for the rail line acquisition. Comments opposing the plan seem to be facilely tabled by verbal assurances promising our concerns are best handled in the design and construction phases after rail acquisition is over. For us, that logic is flawed and puts the proverbial cart before the horse. Once the "funding cart" is full and starts to move, the "Vines horse" will likely be run over. Some of our primary concerns for what the current Rails to Trails project will create for the Vines community are summarized as follows:

1. The safety of Vines homeowners and protection of their property. The present trail plan will bisect our gated-community. The original plan map, that was presented to the public for comment, did not even show our gated-community exists. That alone calls into question (a) the depth of the MPO's research and investigation regarding the plan; and, (b) the adequacy of notice to the sector of the taxpaying public likely to be most detrimentally affected by the plan. Bike trails may be fun for all during the day. However, those using the trail as intended during the day will still have easy, but unauthorized, access to the Estero Country Club facilities (golf course, bathrooms, clubhouse, ponds, etc.) and the Vines community in general. Does it fall to ECC members and Vines residents, with hopefully the help of local law enforcement, to address such trespassing activities?

Most important, what happens at night, say 2 AM? In darkness, the bike trail becomes an open, but sheltered, pathway into the heart of the Vines community. If intruders come having mischievous, or worse yet, criminal intentions, how are Vines residents to protect themselves and their property? Who will keep those miscreants with ATVs, motor cycles/bikes, and other vehicles from vandalizing our golf course and its related amenities? Who pays for the damage done, once the perpetrators escape undetected down the trail to find other things to destroy. Our gatehouse and night guard will have no preventative effect on such nefarious activities. Who pays for the security lights and cameras that may be necessary to provide some help to deter these night-stalkers or to assist the police in identifying the perpetrators?

2. The Trail's disruption to the Vines gated-community would be devasting to those taxpayers who have chosen to buy homes here to enjoy the SWFL lifestyle. Our understanding was that the railway was nonfunctioning since 2008 and that our real estate investment would be safe. So, it was a complete surprise to hear that our local government is pushing ahead, on the MPO's

recommendation, to buy the rail line and convert it to a walking/biking trail. While at the same time, it feels that these same authorities are turning a deaf ear to our concerns. We believe it is likely, with the trail bisecting our community, property values in the Vines will decline relative to other SWFL gated-neighborhoods that do not have running through them such an open invitation to circumvent their security and safety measures. It is also not much of a stretch to expect Lee County may experience an increase in the number of real estate assessment and property tax litigation matters coming from Vines residents.

3. The Vines has only one perimeter road, Vintage Trace, by which vehicular traffic can access all subdivisions of the gated-community. It is an inviting, live-oak and palm lined, private road. About two-thirds of the 440 homes in the Vines lie East of where the proposed rails to trails pathway will cross over this road. Even with proper signage and safety measures, the potential for serious injury from vehicle/bike collisions will be much increased. Finally, emergency vehicles will need to stop at the road/trail intersection prior to advancing to the homes beyond, and possibly negatively affecting the response time when seconds may count

We are not against the Rails to Trail initiative. We are sure many residents of Lee County would enjoy all that a linear park could offer. Our objection is that none of our concerns about security, potential traffic issues and splitting our community in half have been considered, much less addressed, at this point. And, we suspect the same goes for the potential intrusions to the homes in San Carlos Park. All of which can be avoided by an alternate route or better-engineered, mutually-agreeable solutions.
