Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order at approximately 9:30 a.m. by Chair Mike Cook.

Roll Call

Those present introduced themselves. The roll was recorded by MPO staff. There was a quorum. Those members in attendance included Alicia Dixon with the Lee County Port Authority; Dawn Huff with LeeTran; Laura Dodd with Cape Coral; Nicole Monahan with the City of Fort Myers; Matt Noble with the Village of Estero; D'Juan Harris with the Charlotte County - Punta Gorda MPO; Sean Kingston with the Collier MPO; and Mike Cook with the Lehigh Acres Municipal Services Improvement District. Others in attendance included Don Scott and Ron Gogoi with the Lee County MPO; Victoria Peters and Amanda Tyner with FDOT; Steve Ludwinski with Corradino; and Andy Getch, Erik Schmidt, and Melody Matter with McCormick Taylor.

Agenda Item #4 - *Review and Approval of the June 1, 2023 Meeting Summary

Mr. Matt Noble made the motion to approve the June 1, 2023 Meeting Summary. Ms. Laura Dodd seconded the motion. There were no objections, and the motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item #5 - *Review and Approve the August 3, 2023 Joint TAC Meeting Summary

Mr. D'Juan Harris made the motion to approve the August 3, 2023 Meeting Summary. Ms. Laura Dodd seconded the motion. There were no objections, and the motion passed unanimously.

<u>Agenda Item #6 - *Review and Approve the FY 2024 through FY 2028 Transportation</u> <u>Improvement Program (TIP) Roll Forward Amendments</u>

Mr. Don Scott presented this agenda item for the review and approval of the FY 2024 through FY 2028 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Roll Forward Amendments. He reviewed the roll forward project information that was included in the agenda packet, <u>posted to the MPO website</u>, and

shown as slides at the meeting. He asked if there were any questions. There were none. Chair Cook asked for a motion.

Mr. Matt Noble made the motion to approve the FY 2024 through FY 2028 Transportation Improvement Program Roll Forward Amendments. Ms. Dawn Huff seconded the motion. There were no objections, and the motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item #7 - *Review and Approve an Amendment to the FY 2023 - FY 2027 TIP to Add a SR 31 Movable Bridge Safety Project

Mr. Scott presented this agenda item for the review and approval of an Amendment to the FY 2023 through FY 2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to add a SR 31 Movable Bridge Safety Project. He reviewed the amendment information that was included in the agenda packet, posted to the MPO website, and shown as a slide at the meeting. Chair Cook asked for a motion.

Mr. D'Juan Harris made the motion to approve an Amendment to the FY 2023 through FY 2027 Transportation Improvement Program to add a SR 31 Movable Bridge Safety Project. Mr. Matt Noble seconded the motion. There were no objections, and the motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item #8 - *Review and Approve the Updated Public Involvement Plan

Mr. Scott presented this agenda item for the review and approval of the Updated Public Involvement Plan (PIP). Ms. Dawn Huff asked about the TDP (transit development plan) portion. Mr. Scott explained the process and requirements, long range plan, and consistency. Chair Cook asked if there were any other questions, comments, or a motion.

Ms. Dawn Huff made the motion to approve the updated Public Involvement Plan. Mr. Matt Noble seconded the motion. There were no objections, and the motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item #9 - *Approval of the SUN Trail Priorities

Mr. Ron Gogoi presented this agenda item for the review and approval of the Shared-Use Nonmotorized (SUN) Trail Priorities. He noted the SUN Trail priorities were not taken to the BPCC (Bicycle Pedestrian Coordinating Committee) due to the meeting cancellation resulting from Hurricane Idalia, but they would be taken to their September meeting and then to the MPO Board in October. He provided a Power Point presentation that can be viewed at the following link: SUN Trail Priorities He asked if there were any questions. The committee briefly discussed project leadership, bridge sidewalk funding, JYLP overpass, SUN Trail funding cycle, Work Program cycle, other funded JYLP projects, Cape projects, Lee MPO projects, other projects funded in 2025, Senate Bill 106, and bridge funding. Chair Cook asked for a motion.

Mr. D'Juan Harris made the motion to approve the Shared-Use Nonmotorized (SUN) Trail Priorities. Ms. Nicole Monahan seconded the motion. There were no objections, and the motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item #10 - *Endorsement of the Aviation Priorities

Mr. Gogoi presented this agenda item for the endorsement of the Aviation Priorities. He introduced Ms. Alicia Dixon with the Lee County Port Authority (LCPA) to answer any questions. Mr. Gogoi then reviewed the aviation priorities that were emailed to the committee, <u>posted to the MPO website</u>, and are included in the Power Point presentation available at the following link: <u>Aviation Priorities</u> He

asked if there were any questions. The committee briefly discussed local funding, revenue bonds, new tower opening, additional runway, and customer satisfaction award. Chair Cook asked for a motion.

Ms. Dawn Huff made the motion to endorse the Aviation Priorities. Mr. D'Juan Harris seconded the motion. There were no objections, and the motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item #11 - *Review and Approve the SS4A Safety Action Plan Scope of Services

He added that it did go to the TMOC (Traffic Management and Operations Committee) and those comments were included in the updated scope. He reviewed the scope that was attached to the agenda packet, posted to the MPO website, and shown as slides at the meeting. He asked if there were any questions. The committee discussed adding milestones, project time length, dashboard or website to track progress, performance measures, implementation grant, procuring funding for projects, changing requirements for grants, implementation on state roads, example of Charlotte County projects, direct recipient, intersection improvements on state highway systems, increased funding, scope focus on non-state roads, action plans being developed, incorporation into long range transportation plan, and congestion management plan. Chair Cook asked for a motion.

Mr. D'Juan Harris made the motion to approve the Safe Streets for All Safety Action Plan Scope of Services. Mr. Matt Noble seconded the motion. There were no objections, and the motion passed unanimously.

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RECOMMEND MPO ADOPTION OF THE 2024 HIGHWAY SAFETY TARGETS

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Recommend that the MPO Board adopt the same

Highway Safety Performance Measure Targets (PM1)

for 2024 consistent with FDOT.

State DOTs and MPOs are required to adopt Highway Safety Performance Measure (PM1) Targets annually. In Florida, the FDOT has been maintaining 'zero' as the target for the five (5) Highway Safety Performance Measures since the statewide targets were first established in 2018. For each of those years the Lee MPO supported the statewide targets by adopting the same targets and agreed to plan and program projects that once implemented are anticipated to make progress toward achieving the statewide "zero" targets. The PM1 statewide targets for 2024 were set by FDOT on August 31st.

At their October 5th meetings, the TAC and CAC will be asked to recommend that the MPO adopt the same targets as FDOT for its 2024 PM1 targets as shown below.

LEETRAN PRESENTATION ON MOBILITY ON DEMAND

DISCUSSION ITEM:

LeeTran is currently operating Mobility on Demand (MOD) programs in Bonita Springs and Lehigh Acres. The MOD model has been gaining popularity in use among public transit providers as the service allows more personalized service and flexibility.

LeeTran rolled out its first ever MOD initiative in 2022 in the Bonita Springs area and on March 2nd of this year they launched a second one in Lehigh Acres. ULTRA on Demand, as MOD is called in Lee County, supports LeeTran's fixed route service by allowing passengers to travel to destinations within the MPO area or to stops along the fixed route system to reach destinations outside the service area.

At the meeting, LeeTran staff will be providing a presentation on their MOD program and the progress the service has been making in Bonita Springs and Lehigh.

REVIEW AND COMMENT ON PROPOSED 2045 LONG RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN AMENDMENTS

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Review proposed amendments to the 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP).

The MPO staff is amending the 2045 LRTP to be voted on by the Board at an upcoming meeting to address changes to projects based on additional funding from the Moving Florida Forward Program, local funding commitments, and recent Federal and State appropriations. The proposed amendments are listed below and are shown in underline and strike through format on the attached Cost Feasible Tables.

The following changes are being proposed:

- Revise the limits of the SR 78 W. of Santa Barbara to 24th Avenue project to Burnt Store Road to 24th Avenue to address the local funding that is being used for the PD&E study within those limits. Also, adjust the funding to match what has been budgeted for the project.
- Revise the Burnt Store Road from Van Buren to the Charlotte County line design phase to now show this funded with the federal appropriation that was awarded to the County.
- Change the SR 31 from SR 80 to SR 78 project to adjust the phasing to account for the state appropriation funding and the Right-of-Way phased that is now funded.
- Revise the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection project to include the design phase project funded with federal and local funds to match recent changes.
- Add in the widening of I-75 to eight lanes from the Collier County line to Corkscrew Road in the 2024 to 2027 time frame to match the Moving Florida Forward project. Also revise the I-75 managed lanes project currently shown in the Plan to match the typical section that has been shown in the recently completed I-75 South Corridor Master Plan.
